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

We are delighted to say that the inspection went very well, where all our staff and children were an absolute credit to us. As the document from OFSTED has now been officially published, we are delighted to tell you that the school has maintained it's **GOOD** status. A letter will be released to parents in due course. We would like to thank everyone involved for all their hard work in the lead up to the inspection and for your continued support of the school.

### Internet Safety Afternoon

To back up our police workshops for year 5 and 6 last week, we are putting on an Internet Safety Afternoon on Tuesday 6 February for parents and children. Children not attending the workshop will be doing similar activities in class.



One of the highlights of this half term has been the introduction of TT Rock Stars. This is an online system which the children can do at home. We are using a paper system from TT Rock Stars in school to do daily times tables practise in school. The majority of children in school are now accessing TT Rock Stars at home. 
